**Health:** Please be aware that chicken pox is in our school community at present, as are school sores.

## Notices:

Bus: Tranzit allows a set number of passengers on any bus and we have to work to this. Bus users will be aware that we have in place a number of measures to ensure the children have a safe journey and that they get off at the correct bus stop. If there is any change to the bus stop, or if a child is not to go on the bus that day because they are being picked up from school by someone, please either send a note or call the office early in the day. We do not take the word of a child regarding this. It is recommended that a parent supervises their child at the bus stop each morning and is there to meet them in the afternoons, especially for our younger students. If you don't accompany your child to the bus stop in the mornings, and they miss the bus, please have a plan in place for your child to follow i.e they walk straight home to notify you, or to a trusted adults home who can bring them to school.

If there are any incidences at bus stops, please don't hesitate to contact me. Our children are our school ambassadors and any poor choices they make not only reflects badly on them, but on our school as well. At school, we positively reinforce the four components of our Person of Character – Trustworthiness; Fairness; Accountability and Respectfulness, and these good behaviours are also expected of our children while on the school bus.

Our bus rules are: - Please discuss these with your children:-

#### When waiting for / or getting off the bus:-

Stand well back from the bus as it arrives and departs

No jumping from the bus step

Wait until the bus has driven off from your stop before you attempt to cross the road

Cross behind the bus

Never touch external bus controls

#### When on the bus:-

Remain seated at all times, in your allotted seat - no standing, no walking around the bus, no standing on the seats Bags are to be placed on the floor, or under the seat

Never touch door control buttons

Keep noise to a reasonable level – no shouting

No eating or drinking while on the bus

Wait until the bus has stopped completely before you move out of your seat to get off

Don't wear your hat – keep it in your bag

The bus drivers can, and will, refuse any child the right to travel on the bus, if he/she compromises the safety of themselves and or others. This will be for a period of one week, or longer. If the behaviour of that child does not improve after that, they can be refused travel on any of Tranzit buses indefinitely. School can also refuse the right to travel on the bus in certain circumstances such as children repeatedly not adhering to the bus rules and/or failure to pay the bus costs.
