Cluster Athletics: This Thursday the whole school will take part in this Cluster Athletics Day at the TET Stadium in Inglewood. The organisation is as follows:-

<u>We will depart our school at 9.00am, and return by bus time in the afternoon</u> Please don't be late as children have to be in class for the roll to be taken, and outfitted with their T-Shirt before we can go.

<u>Transport:</u> We need cars please for approx. 33 students from Rooms 3 & 4. We have booked 2 busses which will take 86 of our children from Rooms He Puawai, 1 & 2. Children in Rooms 3 & 4 have a transport slip which needs to be returned tomorrow please.

<u>Children to wear/bring:</u> Black shorts from home [we will issue school T-shirts from school] / <u>shoes</u> suitable for sporting activities [no gumboots, no sandals and no bare feet] / plenty of lunch and a bottle of water / a warm jacket or jersey / children must have a sunhat [they can wear their school sunhat on the day]

<u>Year 1 & 2 children from He Puāwai and Rooms 1&2:</u> finish their activities at lunchtime and can, if you wish, be taken home. You must advise the teacher supervising your child that you wish to take them home **AND** the child will need to change out of their school T shirt which <u>must to be handed to the teacher</u> when you 'sign them out'.

HANGI TICKETS / MONEY: Some families are still to return their hangi money... we need your money or your unsold tickets returned by tomorrow morning at the very latest please.

Note: all activities along with food sales, quick fires, raffles etc are to be 'purchased' using \$1 tickets which will be sold from a central 'ticket selling' table. This helps reduce the need for many cash 'floats'.


