Board of Trustees Report: BUS FEE INCREASE - Our bus provider, Tranzit, have advised that our bus costs are to rise in 2019. We have no other option but to pass this increase onto bus users. So from the beginning of the school year in 2019 the bus costs per child will rise from \$16.50 per week to \$18.00 per week, per child. The 'cost cap' of 2 children per family still remains, but this will be reviewed during Term 1. During this review the Board will consult with families who use the bus. In the meantime, please alter your bus payments to include the increased costs. Please remember to use your child's surname and the word 'bus' in your reference.
