Pets Day 2019: This year under advice from the Ministry of Primary Industries we will be having calves at school again along with lambs and chickens. There will <u>not</u> be a competition for goats or any other pets, however children will be welcome to bring other animals [except dogs] to show. No ribbons or trophies will be awarded for these 'other small' animals however the children will get a participation certificate.

CALVES: Calves from each farm will be kept separate at all times and we will have in place a different system for the judging and grand march to ensure there is no nose to nose contact between calves. Calves will be taken home as soon as the prize-giving ceremony is finished.

CHICKENS: Tegel NZ have agreed to allow us to receive day old chicks again this year provided these chickens will be presented at our Pets Day and will then be appropriately housed after its completion. Entry forms will require you to sign a consent form to keep with Tegel and school requirements and expectations. Regardless of whether you decorate a box or not the chicken needs to come in, in a cage, for weighing. In previous years some families have taken chickens which have not been presented for weighing. We have assured Tegel that we will not allow for this to continue so we ask that you please consider your responsibilities before agreeing/accepting a chicken for your child.
